Application

Lucas County has FY20 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) federal funds available to allocate through the Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA). These funds are available to establish or enhance programs with a focus on state and local initiatives, technical assistance, training, personnel, equipment, supplies, contractual support and information systems for criminal justice in qualifying purpose areas (see RFP for purpose areas).

Eligible applicants must be a general-purpose unit of local government (e.g., county, city, township, village) or combined units of government (e.g., Council of Government), or a non-profit organization. The local cash or in-kind match requirement is 25 percent for all eligible projects.

Projects receiving subgrant awards may anticipate a 12-month project period beginning January 1, 2022 and ending December 31, 2022. Projects receiving awards will be expected to complete their stated activities within the 12-month project period.

All JAG proposals must be received by **July 20, 2021 by 4:00 PM**. Application materials may be downloaded from: www.lucascountycjcc.org under the grants section and materials are located within the grant reports and forms section.

A (rescheduled) bidder's training will be held on **June 23, 2021** at 2:00 PM. via Zoom to review requirements and materials required to submit a successful application. Please see the RFP for additional information on the training.
