Re: FY2021 S.T.O.P. Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) Grant Program

Notice of Availability of Funding/Application

Lucas County has FY21 VAWA federal funds available to allocate through the Office of Criminal Justice Services (OCJS). These funds are available to establish or enhance programs under the VAWA Grant Program with a focus on training, enhancement efforts, policy and protocol development, data collection and communication systems, victim service programs and visitation centers, stalking programs, and sexual assault nurse examiners (SANE).

Eligible applicants must be a general-purpose unit of local government (e.g., county, city, township, village) or combined units of government (e.g., Council of Government), or a non-profit organization. The local cash or inkind match requirement is 25 percent for all eligible projects. Non-profit victim service projects may request permission to waive the matching requirement.

Projects receiving subgrant awards may anticipate a 12-month project period beginning January 1, 2022 and ending December 31, 2022. Projects receiving awards will be expected to complete their stated activities within the 12-month project period.

All VAWA proposals must be received by **July 9, 2020 by 4:00 PM**. Application materials may be downloaded from: www.lucascountycjcc.org under the grants section and materials are located within the grant reports and forms section.

A bidder's training will be held on <u>June 23, 2021</u> at 2:00pm via Zoom to review requirements and materials required to submit a successful application. Please see the RFP for additional information on the training.
